Before the seminar, we ask you to familiarize yourself with the other participants' pretasks. You can find them on Moodle - https://moodle.ut.ee/course/view.php?id=9057 . The pre-tasks were the following:

- **Teacher**: The following two tasks
  - Make a 3-5 min interview (audio or video, in English) with one/some of your students where you ask them "What can we name of the institution do to encourage that you take an active role in creating your learning process? What can we do to assess your learning so that it reflects this?"
  - Write a short text (1-2 pages) on what concrete examples you have from your teaching where you encourage students to take an active role in creating the learning process. Pictures, illustrations etc. that supports are much appreciated.
- **Administrator**: The following Two tasks
  - Make a 3-5 minute interview (audio or video, in English) with someone from your university's quality assurance department, where you ask her/him/them "What do we do to assure that our programmes are delivered in a way that encourages students to take an active role in creating the learning process, and that assessment of students reflects this process?"
  - 2. Write a short text (1-2 pages) on what concrete examples from your institution on how the infrastructure (rooms, it-systems, ...) supports Student-Centred Learning. Pictures, illustrations etc. that supports are much appreciated.

When familiarizing, note the things you found most interesting, surprising. Furthermore, consider the following questions: What was the understanding of SCL? Did they have good examples of SCL for specific ways of teaching, was there good examples of facilities supporting SCL, good examples of SCL in face-to-face, on-line or hybrid teaching?
